

2025-2026 STANDARDIZED DRESS CODE ELEMENTARY (K-4) STUDENTS

The complete dress code is listed in the Summit Student-Parent Handbook; this document provides a summary for grades K-4. Summit administration, teachers, and staff reserve the right to determine appropriate or inappropriate dress during school and at school functions. Students are to appear conservative, modest, and appropriate. They should avoid clothing that is overly tight, short, or revealing. These standards apply to uniform, spirit, and free-dress days, and all school-sponsored events including athletic games, performances, field trips, and other activities.

GENERAL

- · Hair styles, makeup, and accessories should be kept in line with the Student Handbook guidelines. (Pgs. 37-39)
- Summit uniforms or Spirit wear must not be altered in any way (e.g., markings or drawings, pins, rips, tears, holes, etc.).
- Students must remain in standardized dress for the entire school day. If a student leaves campus and returns to school, he/she must return to the standard dress code.

SHIRTS / SWEATERS

- · No patterns, insignias, or brand symbols.
- Polo or button-up oxford-style shirt of any solid color (long or short sleeve).
- Students are permitted to layer these shirts with solid-color cardigans (provided an approved shirt is worn underneath), solid-color sweaters, Summit hoodies, and Summit sweatshirts.
- Sweaters must be free of rips, holes, or tears and allow for a range of motion while covering the midsection.
- Summit branded sweatshirts and hoodies, purchased from the Summit Spirit Store, athletic department, or school-sponsored club
 may be worn with uniform pants any day of the week.

SUMMIT SWEATSHIRTS / HOODIES

- · Summit sweatshirts and hoodies may be worn over uniform dress or spirit wear.
- Only Summit jackets / sweatshirts / hoodies may be worn in class.
- Zip up Summit Hoodies must have a uniform shirt underneath.

UNIFORM PANTS/SHORTS

- · Dockers/uniform style pants or walking shorts in black, navy, grey, or tan khaki. Pleated or flat front. Cotton twill.
- No windbreaker, carpenter, drawstring waists, hip huggers, joggers, jeggings, denim, corduroy, knit, or polyester.
- · Must be worn at the appropriate waist level.
- · Shorts must be no shorter than fingertip length.
- Blue jeans may be worn on Spirit Days, the last day of each week.

SKIRTS / SKORTS / LEGGINGS (Girls only)

- · Solid skirts/skorts in black, navy, grey, or tan khaki.
- No shorter than 2 inches from the crease in the back of the knee.
- Under regulated length skirts, any coordinating solid-color leggings may be worn.
- · Elementary girls must wear shorts under their skirts.

JUMPERS / POLO DRESSES (Girls only)

- Solid jumpers in black, navy, grey, or khaki, or polo dresses in any solid color.
- Dresses must rest no shorter than 2 inches from the crease in the back of the knee.
- · Solid colored shorts must be worn underneath jumpers and dresses.

BELTS

- Belts are not required but highly encouraged for grades 1- 4.
- Belts must be black or brown in color.

SHOES

- Must have a closed back, covered toe, clean, and in good condition.
- · Tennis shoes are recommended. Must be fastened, laced, and tied during the school day.
- · Boots, casual, and dress shoes are permitted.
- · No flip-flops, "Crocs," roller skate shoes, mules, athletic slides, house slippers, or "light up" shoes.

SPIRIT DAY ATTIRE

- The last day of each week is Spirit Day. School administration may select other days as Spirit Days.
- · Students may wear Summit branded t-shirts/sweatshirts/hoodies with (blue only) jeans, jean shorts, or uniform bottoms.
- No overalls or jegging permitted. No markings, drawings, pins, rips, tears, holes, etc.
- Summit-branded joggers and hats, purchased from the Summit spirit store or athletic department, are permitted on Spirit Day.
- · Eligible spirit wear clothing must be purchased from the Summit spirit store, athletic department, or school-sponsored club.
- Students not participating in Spirit Days need to be in full school uniform.

DRESS STANDARDS FOR SCHOOL EVENTS

- Students are expected to follow Summit's guidelines for modesty, fit, and length when attending any school-sponsored event, including but not limited to after-school athletic events, group meetings, field trips, performances, and other school-sponsored activities.
- · Non-compliance will be treated as an Honor Code violation and considered a Level 1 infraction (see page 33).



2025-2026 STANDARDIZED DRESS CODE INTERMEDIATE (5-8) and HIGH SCHOOL (9-12) STUDENTS

The complete dress code is listed in the Summit Student-Parent Handbook; this document provides a summary for grades 5-12. Summit administration, teachers, and staff reserve the right to determine appropriate or inappropriate dress during school and at school functions. Students are to appear conservative, modest, and appropriate. They should avoid clothing that is overly tight, short, or revealing. These standards apply to uniform, spirit, and free-dress days, and all school-sponsored events including athletic games, performances, field trips, and other activities.

GENERAL

- · Hairstyles, makeup, and accessories should be kept in line with the Student Handbook guidelines. (Pgs. 37-39)
- · Summit uniforms or Spirit wear must not be altered in any way (e.g., markings or drawings, pins, rips, tears, holes, etc.).
- Students must remain in standardized dress for the entire school day. If a student leaves campus and returns to school, he/she must return to the standard dress code.

SHIRTS / SWEATERS

- No patterns, insignias, or brand symbols.
- Polo or button-up oxford-style shirt of any solid color (long or short sleeve).
- Students are permitted to layer these shirts with solid-color cardigans (provided an approved shirt is worn underneath), solid-color sweaters, Summit hoodies, and Summit sweatshirts.
- Uniform shirts should display no patterns, insignias, or brand symbols.
- Sweaters must be a solid color, free of rips, holes, or tears, and allow for a range of motion while covering the midsection.
- Summit branded sweatshirts and hoodies, purchased from the Summit Spirit Store, athletic department, or school-sponsored club may be worn with uniform pants any day of the week.
- **High school privileges (grades 9-12 only):** (a) Sweaters may be worn without a polo underneath, unless the sweater is wide-necked; (b) Summit branded t-shirts, purchased from the Summit Spirit Store, athletic department, or school-sponsored club may be worn with uniform pants any day of the week.

SUMMIT SWEATSHIRTS / HOODIES

- Summit sweatshirts and hoodies may be worn over uniform dress or spirit wear.
- Only Summit jackets/sweatshirts/hoodies may be worn in class.
- Zip-up Summit Hoodies must have a uniform shirt underneath.

UNIFORM PANTS / SHORTS

- · Dockers/uniform style pants or walking shorts in black, navy, grey, or tan khaki. Pleated or flat front. Cotton twill.
- No leggings, hip huggers, jeggings, carpenter, denim, corduroy, knit, windbreaker or polyester.
- Must be worn at the appropriate waist level.
- Shorts must be no shorter than fingertip length.
- Blue jeans may be worn on Spirit Days, the last day of each week.

SKIRTS / SKORTS / LEGGINGS (Girls only)

- Solid skirts/skorts in black, navy, grey, or tan khaki.
- No shorter than 2 inches from the crease in the back of the knee.
- Under regulated length skirts, any coordinating solid-color leggings may be worn.

SHOES

- Tennis shoes, Boots, casual, dress shoes, and Birkenstock style sandals with two or more straps are permitted. Heels worn must not exceed 2".
 - No flip-flops, "Crocs," roller skate shoes, mules, athletic slides, or house slippers.

GROOMING

- The first step to applying for college is applying deodorant. Also: Shower... with soap. You know who you are.
- Hair should be clean, neatly groomed, and capable of being kept away from the eyes.
- Only hair colors and tints that fall within the "natural" color range and pattern are acceptable.
- Simple, stylized lines are acceptable if neat and non-distracting. However, insignias, symbols, logos, or other identifiable images shaved, carved, or dyed into the hair are not permitted.
- Facial hair must be groomed, clean, and not extreme in length.

JEWELRY & ACCESSORIES

- Boys may not wear earrings, ear studs, or jewelry in any pierced body part.
- · Girls may wear modest earrings in the ears only. Earrings may not be worn in any other pierced body part.
- A simple necklace or chain is permitted around the neck.
- Watches are allowed as long as any alarms or features do not disturb the learning environment. Smartwatches are strictly prohibited in elementary and intermediate schools. High school use of smart watches and wearables will fall under the guidelines of the personal electronic device policy. (See page 28)
- Students are not allowed to have permanent tattoos at any time. If a student already has a tattoo before enrolling, they must ensure it remains covered while on school campus or attending Summit functions.
- · Students are prohibited from marking or drawing on themselves with ink, markers, or similar materials.
- Caps, hats, bandanas, and scarves are not to be worn inside the building unless permitted for a specific spirit day.
- Hoods may not be worn in class.

SPIRIT DAY ATTIRE

- The last day of each week is Spirit Day. School administration may select other days as Spirit Days.
- Students may wear Summit branded t-shirts/sweatshirts/hoodies with (blue only) jeans, jean shorts, or uniform bottoms.
- No overalls or jegging permitted. No markings, drawings, pins, rips, tears, holes, etc.
- · Summit-branded joggers and hats, purchased from the Summit spirit store or athletic department, are permitted on Spirit Day.
- · Eligible spirit wear clothing must be purchased from the Summit spirit store, athletic department, or school-sponsored club.
- Students not participating in Spirit Days need to be in full school uniform.
